Overview

Arkansas State University ranks 134 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 60 and a D- speech climate grade.

It ranks in the top 50 for “Disruptive Conduct” and “Administrative Support,” showing lower student acceptance of non-peaceful protest and higher trust in the administration. The campus lands in the bottom 25 for “Self-Censorship,” indicating students frequently stay silent. It also tumbled 100 places on “Political Tolerance” after ranking in the top 25 last year, indicating reduced student willingness to host controversial speakers.

Arkansas State earns a “yellow light” Spotlight rating and should revise its student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating. It should adopt the pro-free speech Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality. It should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded.
