## Overview

University of California, Davis ranks 24 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 73 and a C speech climate grade, climbing 228 places and 18 points from last year. UC Davis earns a “green light” Spotlight rating and has adopted the pro-free speech Chicago Statement and institutional neutrality.

UC Davis ranks in the top 50 on “Administrative Support,” showing students trust officials to defend speech. Its “Self-Censorship” rank jumped 144 places from last year, indicating less hesitation to speak. However, it lands in the bottom 25 on “Disruptive Conduct,” showing student acceptance of non-peaceful forms of protest.

It should clearly and forcefully defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded. Doing so will demonstrate the university’s commitment to free speech and build community trust that the administration will defend expressive rights.
