## Overview

American University ranks 155 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 59 and an F speech climate grade, dropping 37 places from last year.

AU ranks in the top 50 for “Openness,” meaning fewer contentious topics feel off-limits to students. It lands in the bottom 50 for “Political Tolerance” and “Administrative Support,” showing reduced student willingness to host controversial speakers and little trust that officials will defend speech.

AU’s Faculty Senate affirmed the pro-free speech Chicago Statement, but it retains a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. AU should revise student codes to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating and adopt an official commitment to institutional neutrality. Given its weak showing on “Administrative Support,” administrators should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded.
