## Overview

Amherst College ranks 106 out of 261 schools in the 2027 College Free Speech Rankings with a score of 62 and a D- speech climate grade, falling 36 places from last year.

Amherst ranks in the top 25 for “Political Tolerance,” jumping 119 places, showing greater student willingness to host speakers across the ideological spectrum. It places in the top 50 for “Administrative Support,” indicating students trust officials to defend free speech.

Amherst retains a “yellow light” Spotlight rating. It should revise student policies to earn a “green light” Spotlight rating and adopt the pro-free speech Chicago Statement and an official commitment to institutional neutrality. It should respond clearly and forcefully to defend free speech whenever censorship occurs or is demanded. Doing so will demonstrate the college’s commitment to free speech and build community trust that the administration will defend expressive rights.
